

MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT AND CEO

After two years of ongoing adaptation to meet the challenges of the pandemic, 2022-2023 was a year that saw a return to business as usual, within the context of a new normal when it comes to homelessness, COVID-19 laid. bare some complex issues and created new ones that have considerably altered the face of homelessness in Montreal. The impact of the pandemic combined with the current housing crisis will long be felt. The services of the Old Brewery Mission are growing, largely because the population experiencing homelessness is increasing and diversifying. The people who now come through our doors are facing a variety of challenges: seniors with cognitive loss, undocumented immigrants, women who have experienced violence, people with addictions or mental health issues.

In response to these new realities, we have been creative in developing and adapting our services, —prevention, emergency services and rehousing—to meet the specific needs of these new client groups. It is with this in mind that our Homelessness Prevention Department has developed some promising partnerships with organizations that work with specific populations such as asylum seekers. We have also developed a new Mobile Support Team focused on reaffiliation, which for the first time enabled us to reach out to individuals outside our walls and offer them psychosocial counselling to support their rehousing. Our real estate portfolio also diversified with

the opening of the Voisines de Lartigue, a new complex for women with 12 studio apartments located a stone's throw from the Patricia Mackenzie Pavilion, as well as the completion of the Logements du Parc in the Plateau-Mont-Royal neighbourhood, which contains 24 studio apartments for men. Numerous other housing projects with adapted support are also under development and will come to fruition over the next two years.

It is by staying on this path of developing long-term and adapted solutions that we will continue to meet the changing needs of people at risk of or experiencing homelessness.

OUR SERVICES

The Old Brewery Mission continues to expand its presence in Montreal and grow its emergency and community housing services to help as many people as possible experiencing or at risk of homelessness to achieve residential stability.



INNOVATING TO PREVENT HOMELESSNESS

2022-2023 was the first full year of operation for the Old Brewery Mission's **Homelessness Prevention** Department. Still in its infancy, our prevention team has made great strides. We are developing our expertise in this area in order to act both at the structural level, by supporting prevention through the work of the Québec **Homelessness Prevention** Policy Collaborative (Q-HPPC), and at the individual level, through our applied prevention programs. All our actions have a common goal: helping people in precarious situations avoid homelessness.



PARTNERING FOR PREVENTION

The effectiveness of our Homelessness Prevention Department depends largely on the collaborations we forge with new and long-standing partners. Since the launch of the service, we have established 10 partnerships. As a result, in a single year we received 90 referrals and helped 17 people find a housing solution suited to their needs.

PASSERELLE, A JOINT PROGRAM WITH THE OMHM

During the year, our Homelessness Prevention Department became the main partner of the referral service of the Office municipal d'habitation de Montréal (OMHM) for the Passerelle program. Launched as a pilot project in 2021, Passerelle is a prevention program that provides people at imminent risk of homelessness with psychosocial support and help in searching for accommodations until they move into a new home or are referred to another appropriate resource. Over the course of the year, 37 people were referred to the Prevention Department under this initiative.

We want to change the way people think about homelessness and put more effort into prevention, so that we reduce the number of people who end up on the street. We have to target people who are at high risk of homelessness but we must also think more broadly...what structural changes are needed to reduce precariousness in our society?

RESEARCH

During the year, the Old Brewery Mission's Research Department pressed ahead with its activities on several fronts. Team members served as experts on other projects and the Research Department continued developing and carrying out its research projects, which included a study of the Old Brewery Mission's partnership with the Montreal police department and an evaluation of our community rehousing programs.

Report on partnership with SPVM released

In March 2023, the Old Brewery Mission's Research Department published its report on the organization's partnership and collaborative relationship with the Montreal police department (SPVM). The findings and recommendations, based on interviews with SPVM officers conducted in 2021, were presented to SPVM personnel who deal with homelessness.

As well, Hannah Brais, the project coordinator and lead researcher, attended the International Journal on Homelessness conference in Chicago in March 2023 to share the findings.

Research project on rent banks to prevent homelessness

During the year, our Research and Prevention departments worked with the Q-HPPC on a study of emergency assistance models for people facing eviction to identify the most promising practices in this approach to preventing homelessness. The project received funding from the Federal Government's Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council.



QUÉBEC HOMELESSNESS PREVENTION POLICY COLLABORATIVE

The Québec Homelessness Prevention Policy Collaborative (Q-HPPC) is a joint initiative of the Old Brewery Mission and McGill University's Department of Equity, Ethics and Policy. It brings together stakeholders from different backgrounds (community, academic and political) to identify structural changes that can be recommended to government bodies in order to prevent homelessness.

Q-HPPC's first research report

On November 25, 2022, Q-HPPC's gender research group published its first report, which contained concrete recommendations for reforming Quebec's laws to better protect women experiencing intimate partner violence.


In conjunction with the report, an op-ed signed by the co-chairs of the gender research group and the co-chairs of Q-HPPC ran in *Le Devoir* and two articles were published in *Le Devoir* and *The Gazette*. At the same time, Q-HPPC members lobbied federal, provincial and municipal elected officials, leading to five meetings with members of the National Assembly and two meetings with municipal councillors. The report was shared through the newsletters of our homelessness and prevention partners.

Meeting with Canada's Federal Housing Advocate

Q-HPPC's steering committee and the research group co-chairs met with Federal Housing Advocate Marie-Josée Houle on February 24, 2023. The meeting was an opportunity to discuss homelessness prevention and the right to housing, and the members of the working groups shared their public policy recommendations to prevent housing insecurity.









WEBSTER PAVILION EMERGENCY SERVICES

The Webster Pavilion remains our primary emergency shelter facility for men. Open 24/7, with a total capacity of 197, it offers a variety of programs to meet the specific needs of an increasingly diverse clientele. The annual occupancy rate held steady at 90%.

Between April 2022 and March 2023, there were 843 stays at the Webster emergency shelter by 633 individuals, 411 of whom were there for the first time. There were 116 organized departures to adapted housing solutions.

HÔTEL-DIEU EMERGENCY SERVICES

During the year, we continued working closely with the Welcome Hall Mission to provide emergency housing services at Hôtel-Dieu hospital's Le Royer Pavilion. The Welcome Hall Mission provides evening and overnight support and supervision, while our staff offers daytime psychosocial counselling to help individuals find a stable home again.

We are able to accommodate a wide variety of people at Hôtel-Dieu, including men, women and couples, as well as people with pets. The high tolerance threshold at the facility also means that individuals with more complex issues, who often fall through the cracks, have access to emergency housing and counselling.

During the year, the occupancy rate at Le Royer Pavilion was 99%, a clear indication of the importance and need for this facility. A total of 597 individuals were accommodated, 379 of whom were staying there for the first time.

NEW ALCOHOL MANAGEMENT PROGRAM

In April 2022, the Old Brewery Mission launched its Alcohol Management Program at the Saint-Laurent Campus, in partnership with the CIUSSS du Centre-Sud-de-l'Île-de-Montréal. The program is the first of its kind to be offered directly in an emergency shelter in Montreal. Its aim is to stabilize the health of people experiencing homelessness who have a chronic drinking problem by administering a controlled amount of alcohol.

The program was still operating as of March 31, 2023, but not without difficulty and at reduced capacity. Five participants were still in the program and had stabilized their alcohol consumption. The project has many benefits, primarily for users, including better management of their mental and physical health, fewer falls and hospitalizations, and less problematic behavior that could lead to expulsion.

This project demonstrated that with adequate resources community organizations working with people experiencing homelessness can offer alcohol management programs.

To be noted: The project was paused in the spring of 2023 so that the program parameters could be reassessed.

END OF THE COVID-19 ISOLATION ZONE

On March 31, 2023, we were finally able to close the isolation zone for people experiencing homelessness who have COVID-19. Between October 2020 and March 2023, 2,055 people were able to isolate safely, including 293 from April 2022- March 2023. We worked on this project in conjunction with the City of Montreal and the CIUSSS du Centre-Sud-de-l'Île-de-Montréal, demonstrating our ability to carry out projects of this scale. In fact, in 2022 we won the *Prix d'excellence du réseau de la santé et des services sociaux* (an award of excellence) in the category of *Impact sur la communauté* (community impact).

This project helped us minimize the risks to our clientele and staff during the pandemic. In addition, despite the crisis and the urgency of the situation, there were also positive developments and learnings during this period including the development of new practices in the management of drug and alcohol addiction in emergency services.



OUTREACH: FIRST CONTACT WITH OUR CLIENTS

Our outreach services including the Café Mission Keurig respite centre, the shuttle and the new Mobile Support Team, enable us to make contact with vulnerable populations who don't always use the shelter services offered by Montreal's homelessness organizations. In addition to meeting users' basic needs (food, warmth, hygiene, mobility), these services allow our intervention teams to establish a relationship with these individuals and to try to help them transition to rehousing.

We were very pleased to receive funding to keep the respite centre open all night, during the summer and winter. As a result, the centre was able to stay open from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Monday through Friday, and from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. every day. There were over 30,000 daytime visits, an average of 144 per day, and almost 20,000 nighttime visits, an average of 71 per night. The Café Mission worked as a gateway to our other emergency services, bringing 318 people into our emergency housing programs and starting them on the path to finding a secure and permanent home.



REAFFILIATION MOBILE SUPPORT TEAM

Towards the end of the 2022-2023 fiscal year, several months of work went into setting up the support team for the Old Brewery Mission Mobile Clinic, powered by TELUS Health. The mobile clinic quietly began operating in March 2023, and was officially launched in April at a press conference with TELUS Health and other project collaborators.

In partnership with Accueil Bonneau, the Mobile Support Team offers cohabitation and reaffiliation support services, including tax clinics, legal clinics and referrals, to people experiencing homelessness in Montreal. It connects to people who don't come to emergency shelters and engages with them in public spaces. Other partners, such as the Mobile Legal Clinic and McGill University's Ingram School of Nursing, provide complementary services to support sustainable reaffiliation for this population.



POLICE TRAINING

This year, we continued our partnerships with the Montreal police department and Quebec's police academy, the École nationale de police du Québec, with an aim of improving relations between police and people experiencing homelessness.

Our teams held 16 training sessions to 48 evaluating officers from Quebec's police academy. We are the only community partner to offer this learning opportunity to police cadets in Quebec. In addition, 69 police technology students visited our facilities to learn more about the realities of our environment, while being immersed in it.

JOINING FORCES: TROIS PAS DE PLUS PLAN

As a follow-up to the *Un pas de plus* plan published in the spring of 2021, we worked with the other members of the Mouvement pour mettre fin à l'itinérance à Montréal to produce *Trois pas de plus... pour mettre fin à l'itinérance*. The plan, presented to the various bodies responsible for addressing homelessness, outlines how to put housing resources and support services in place in order to significantly reduce the number of people experiencing homelessness in Montreal.

We don't want to leave anyone behind. That's why we need to go beyond the walls of the Old Brewery Mission and reach out to people who, for one reason or another, don't use our existing services but still need support to get back into housing.

As pandemic conditions improved during the year, the situation stabilized at the Patricia Mackenzie Pavilion (PMP), our emergency shelter for women. We were again able to offer emergency accommodation for up to 46 women a night through our various programs: Étape, Étape+, the PRISM mental health program and Voisines du PMP.

During the year, **395 women** used the services at Patricia Mackenzie Pavilion:

144

women stayed at the emergency shelter for the first time

372

women entered the Étape and Étape+ programs

women were referred to Voisines du PMP, and 18 of them subsequently moved into adapted housing

NEW SETUP AT THE PMP

Thanks to the generosity of a private donor, we are able to launch a major renovation project at the Patricia Mackenzie Pavilion (PMP) and finally do away with the dormitory layout. The second floor, which houses the Étape and Étape+ programs, will be renovated to create 13 semi-private rooms that will house 26 residents. They will provide a more private, quieter and more relaxing environment for residents, facilitating the process of long-term reaffiliation.



As Montreal's homeless population grows and changes, we need to find innovative solutions that are long-term and adapted to the realities of individuals to help more people get off the street. This means broadening our range of housing options. We are doing so through new community housing projects and by enlisting the help of private landlords.

OFFICIAL OPENING OF THE VOISINES DE L'ARTIGUE

During the year, we opened the doors to our latest housing project for women, Voisines de Lartigue. Ideally located just a few steps from our Patricia Mackenzie Pavilion, the building includes 12 studio apartments that can accommodate women living in precarity.

The first residents moved in on August 1, 2022, and the facility was officially inaugurated on February 10, 2023 at a press conference attended by government representatives. The event generated extensive media coverage for the project and drew attention to our long-term solutions to homelessness.

The project was made possible in part by funding from the Federal Government's Rapid Housing Initiative. Also, thanks to the Rent Supplement Program of the Office municipal d'habitation de Montréal, residents pay rent in proportion to their monthly income.

INTERNAL COLLABORATION TO PREVENT HOMELESSNESS

The Housing Support Services Department quickly became a key part of the success of the Old Brewery Mission's new Homelessness Prevention Department. Having our own prevention and rehousing programs speeds up the search for appropriate housing solutions for people at risk of homelessness and their entry into our programs. It means they can avoid the potentially difficult and traumatic experience of living in an emergency shelter.

The efficient coordination of the departments toward the success of our new vision of homelessness prevention is thanks to their efforts and dedication. Our Liaison Coordinator, Prevention and Housing Support Services facilitates the relationship between the two teams. With a high-level view of both the referrals received by the prevention team as well as the housing options, the person in this position simplifies the communication between the departments and streamlines the process.

SENTINELS PROGRAM

The Sentinels program is aimed at veterans experiencing or at risk of homelessness, a population that can be difficult to identify. The program's purpose is to help these individuals find housing adapted to their needs and achieve residential stability. The process begins as soon as the person's military background is confirmed. The intervention team goes to meet them wherever they are, be it on the street, in an encampment, or in a shelter. Once they are housed, they receive ongoing support from our staff.

It is very important to maintain and develop this program: no veteran should end up on the street. We are proud of the very existence of this project, which is already an achievement. The Sentinels program would not be possible without our partners and collaborators at the Table d'action des anciens militaires en itinérance (TAAMI).



PREPARING FOR MOVE-IN DAY AT TWO NEW HOUSING PROJECTS

Our Community Housing Development and Housing Support Services teams worked hard in the final months of the fiscal year to get our two newest rehousing projects off to a good start. Both successfully opened on May 1, 2023, requiring that the buildings be move-in ready and that the new tenants' files be prepared by that date.

Logements du Parc, the Old Brewery Mission's newest community housing project for male residents, is a renovated former hotel which has 24 studio apartments as well as common areas.

The other project is located on Dézéry St. and is owned by the Société d'habitation populaire de l'Est de Montréal. The Old Brewery Mission provides housekeeping services as well as ongoing support for the residents. This is another housing solution that can meet the diverse needs of people experiencing or at risk of homelessness.

For both projects, we developed relationships with homelessness organizations as well as roundtables already active in the district in order to integrate the projects into the community and promote social cohabitation for our clients in their new neighbourhood.

Our loyal partner Bread & Beyond provided Essential Boxes starter kits to help residents set up their new homes.



STRENGTHENING OUR PARTNERSHIPS WITH PRIVATE HOUSING OWNERS

With the aim of steadily improving and increasing the supply of housing available to people who have experienced homelessness, our Housing Support Services teams are working on a new project with private housing owners, whose participation and collaboration are essential for achieving our goal of helping our clients find secure, stable homes.

Private-sector housing enhances and diversifies our housing offer (in terms of unit type, location, included services, level of follow-up, etc.), enabling each individual to obtain a home that suits their needs. This is why the participation and collaboration of private housing owners is essential.

REHOUSING BY THE NUMBERS

During the year 2022-2023, the Old Brewery Mission provided housing assistance to 347 people through various programs.

Housing is a fundamental right for all. With the current housing crisis, we need to be innovative to offer adapted lasting rehousing solutions for people who have experienced or are at risk of homelessness.


MISSION POUR ELLES GALA

THE SUPPER EXPERIENCE IS BACK

As the pandemic situation improved over the course of the year, we were able to resume our flagship fundraising event, the Supper Experience. Over the course of the year, some 30 groups helped serve meals to residents at the Webster Pavilion, and \$49,273 was raised. These events provide participants with an enriching and rewarding experience while raising funds for the Old Brewery Mission.

HOLIDAY PARTY FOR PMP RESIDENTS

The Patricia Mackenzie Pavilion (PMP) celebrated the holiday season with an evening of good fun that was enjoyed by all. The party would not have been possible without the generosity of Morgan Stanley. We would also like to thank ELLE TRAITEUR, Fishmonger Simon Saint-Pierre and Marché Tondreau for the buffet, Julie Dionne for being the MC, John P. Carpenter for his Elvis impersonation and DJ Lucky Luc for the music.

IN THE MEDIA

This year we made some good strides in our communications and media relations efforts: we maintained our public profile as experts in the field by publishing 10 op-eds and responding to over 200 requests for interviews on a wide range of subjects.

THE STREET IS NOT A HOME

In December, we launched "The street is not a home," a new marketing campaign devised by the creative team at Insubordination to increase public awareness of homelessness and raise funds to support our programs. The campaign was rolled out through social media, television, posters and billboards.

The powerful ads underscored the unacceptable reality of living on the street in Quebec by using the visual style and language of short-term apartment rental mobile apps. The campaign was highlighted and celebrated in online articles by two prominent local news sources.

NEW CHAIR OF THE BOARD

The Old Brewery Mission appointed Louis Audet as Chair of its Board of Directors in October 2022. Mr. Audet joined our Board in 2020 as a director, following his tenure as chair of the campaign cabinet of our major fundraising campaign from 2014 to 2020. His appointment was the subject of a live interview with Patrice Roy on Le Téléjournal.

PARTNERSHIP WITH RENAISSANCE

As winter approached, we were fortunate to be able to partner with the non-profit thrift-store operator Renaissance. Renaissance set up two Walls of Kindness in Montreal to collect winter coats for people in need.

Nearly 1,000 coats were donated for distribution to people experiencing homelessness in Montreal.

Two media events were organized in connection with the initiative, one for the launch of the Walls of Kindness and the other for the official delivery of the coats.

NEW MEMBERS OF THE MANAGEMENT TEAM

A number of new faces were added to the management team during the year. Marie-Pier Therrien is the new Director of Communications and acts as the spokesperson, bringing her vitality and expertise to the team. Anne Cabaret joined the Old Brewery Mission as Director of Community Housing Development and oversees the successful development of our many real estate projects. And Marc-André Houde became Director of Facilities and Maintenance; under his leadership, numerous building renovation and improvement projects are planned for the coming months.




